## Next Month's Guest Speaker

Next month's guest speaker will be James M. MacMillan LL.B, and his presentation will be "**LAW ON WAR**".

## Meeting Highlights :

- Our March meeting was held at Sir Sandford Fleming College facility instead of our usual location at the Masonic Temple.

    - closing agenda (time and location once all tours completed).
- Then the group was directed to Room 280 (small lecture room) where the opening exercises were to take place.
- Once all were settled into their seats, Bruce announced that the meeting would be opened by a group singing of our National Anthem – O'Canada.
- Next on the agenda, Bruce introduced the Principal of the Sir Sandford Fleming College Lindsay Campus, Ms. Linda Skilton, who welcomed and addressed the group.
- A brief outline of her address :
  - she welcomed both clubs to the college facility;
  - gave brief outline of personal background (present and pass);
  - present day operations of the college (agendas and student body);
  - new directions or agendas that were in line for the college in the future;
  - extended a thank-you to our Probus for club for showcasing their college facility to outside visitors.

- Richard's topics were as follows :
  - a message from the mayor of Newmarket, Tony Van Bynen;
  - informed the group about the presentation to follow;
  - gave a brief background of the guest speaker;
  - called upon another member of their group to introduce guest speaker Mr. Wes Playter, whom he was quite familiar with.
- A brief outline of the items that Wes talked to during his very informative presentation about the City of Newmarket :
  - brief outline of his own personal background (past and present);
  - early origin of the town now a city;
  - history of :
    - early Quaker settlements;
    - hotels, utilities and federal buildings;
    - transportation, canals and locks systems;

    - and a final question and answer period to end the presentation.
