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Meeting Highlights :

 - next month's guest speaker will be Shelagh Grant, the author of the award winning book "**Polar Imperative**";
 - he requested her to bring copies of her book just in case any member would like to purchase a copy (\$18.44) ;
 - she informed Ted that she would be more than pleased to sign any new or existing copies for the membership during her visit.
- Next President Max informed the membership that he had received a response from nine of our members that wished to volunteer their time for the Lilac Gardens work detail. - Colin's presentation "**Forensic Hypnosis**"; and its use in the field of law enforcement.

 - typical session;
 - tools of the trade (chains, lights, music, eye staring, spinning watches, etc.);
 - modern uses (weight loss, quit smoking, and other personal fears);
 - who can be hypnotized – 90% of people can be if they choose to be;
 - what it is like to be hypnotized;
 - Forensic Hypnosis – allowing witnesses or victims to remember things or situations;
 - famous cases;
 - problems and pitfalls using hypnosis;
 - and finally the future of this practice.
- Upon completion of the presentation, Ron Morgan, thanked him on behalf of the membership and presented him with a Probus Club stein.
- As the last order of business, President Max adjourned the meeting and some of the members travelled to the Lindsay Golf Club for a buffet luncheon.

“ WHO AM I ” MEMBERS OF THE MONTH




My name is : **Robert Shields**.

As for my hobbies, I have no real hobbies, but enjoy visiting art museums.




My name is : **Harry Newton**.
