- A brief outline of the items that he talked about during his very informative presentation - "The Future Of The Health Care In Ontario":

#### o Personal Note:

- Presently is 60 years of age (regardless of what it said in the paper);
- o born and raised in the City of Lindsay;
- o received elementary and secondary education in Lindsay;
- o went to medical school at the University of Toronto;
- after graduation, he started his first practice n Bobcaygeon, Ontario:
- during his medical career, he has been part of medical tours /teams that have travelled and provided aid in remote northern parts of our country and the world that required medical assistance at that particular time (North West Territories, British Columbia, India, etc.);
- o has been a member of Ross Memorial Hospital Management Committee (holding a number of different positions) over the years;
- lately, just finished a nine year term as its' Chief of Staff;
- known as an exceptional gardener.

#### Presentation Outline :

- Where the health system is at the present time and some its' problems:
  - wait times, hospital budgets, shortage of screening and testing image equipment, patience medical history data distribution and storage, creation of silo groups, etc.;
- o what the explanations are, how do we get there and the time frame for these improvements;
- o as an example, he talked about a number of particular medical condition or situations that he experienced over the course of years, how the medical system has been greatly improved to handle them for everyone concerned.
- He stated with a definite "YES"; that all the required improvements to our health care system, which he presented during his presentation, can be accomplished. They can be accomplished by getting everyone involved; the government, medical institutions or groups and general public.
- Dr. Drury indicated that a continuing problem is the area of mental health.
- The main point of this presentation, was to get the message out to the public that each and every one of us need to get more involved in our own health issues.
- Upon completion of his presentation, he was thanked by club member Ed Chan
  on behalf of the membership and was presented with a Probus crystal stein.
- Next order of business, a group discussion was conducted by Vice President Max regarding the up-coming Christmas Party for 2011 (location, menu, costs).
- President Stewart adjourned the meeting as the last order of business and then a large number of members accompanied Dr. Drury to St. Dave's Restaurant for an enjoyable luncheon.


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
