Meeting Highlights:

- President Max Radiff called the meeting to order; followed by a group singing of "O Canada".
- He then questioned the group to see who was interested in attending the luncheon after the meeting at Murphy's Den at the Lindsay Golf Club which is located on Lindsay Street South.
- Next Max called upon Vice President Ted Abbot to come forward and introduce our guest speaker Sarah Tate:
 - pride and joy is her family, a mother of three children;
 - past entrepreneur, owning two successful businesses;
 - has been part of the following organizations:
 - past board member and fundraising Chair for Peterborough Youth Emergency Shelter;
 - committee member and Housing Supply Subcommittee Chair for AHAC (Affordable Housing Action Committee);
 - committee member and Housing Chair for Peterborough Poverty Reduction Network.
 - holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in English from University of Waterloo:
 - worked as a Corporate Marketing and Sales Manager for five years prior to her move back to Peterborough;
 - officially appointed Executive Director of Habitat for Humanity Peterborough and District in September 2010.
- Her presentation was titled, "Expanding Our Footprint Habitat For Humanity's Expansion Into The City Of Kawartha Lakes" and find below a brief outline of it:
 - o She started her presentation by stating; "I consider myself one of the most fortunate individuals on the planet because I get to work for an organizations that inspires me, that drives me to do better and to do more and that allows me to help others to be part of the solution".
 - The problem of poverty has been around for many years and it is huge, complex and multifaceted problem.
 - The Habitat for Humanity's core belief is the power of action, rolling up our sleeves and tackling the problem head on to get the iob done.
 - Of particular concern for us is the vicious cycle of poverty.
 - In economics, the cycle of poverty is the "set of factors or events by which poverty, once started, is likely to continue unless there is outside intervention".
 - She continued by elaborating on how poverty impacts children:
 - reduces motivation to learn, delayed cognitive development, lower achievement, and less participation in extracurricular activities;
 - lower career aspirations, interrupted school attendance, higher dropout rates and lower university attendance.
 - Next she presented a summary of Habitat for Humanity (HFH) Worldwide and in Canada:
 - building homes in more than 90 countries worldwide;
 - built more than 6000 homes around the world;
 - 68 affiliates across Canada more than 2000 homes
 - HFH Peterborough and District began in 2002; built 6 homes between 2002 - 2008 and 11 homes in 2009.

- She continued by explaining the process:
 - volunteers and the families themselves build HFH homes;
 - once selected, families give 500 sweat equity hours;
 - materials and services are either 100% donated, heavily discounted or paid for by corporate, faith and individual donations.
 - selected and approved families purchase the HFH home at fair market value.
 - > families pay a mortgage and taxes like everyone else on the street.
 - monthly principal payments go directly into a Fund For Humanity Restricted Account and will go only towards the building of the next home.
- She informed the group that the Peterborough Habitat affiliate had approved an expansion to include the City or Kawartha Lakes and Haliburton. They have development a partnership with City of Kawartha Lakes Haliburton Housing Corp and they have secured a property from the City located on Hamilton Street where 24 new affordable units will be built 16 by the Housing Corp and 8 will be Habitat affordable homeownership semis.
- She ended his presentation by presenting three important facets of HFH:
 - OUR VISION: A world where everyone has a safe, decent, and affordable place to live.
 - OUR MISSION: to mobilize volunteers, donors and community partners in building affordable housing and promoting home ownership as a mean to break the cycle of poverty.
 - OUR VALUES: Housing for All: We believe that access to safe, decent and affordable housing is a basic human right that should be available to all.
- Club member Jim Buchanan thanked Sarah for her presentation and presented her with an honorarium.
- At the start of the business meeting Max extended a warm welcome to all the quests that were in attendance at today's meeting and asked them to consider becoming active members.
- Next Max present highlights from June 4th Management Committee meeting:
 - o Tickets for the September BBQ are now on sale, \$15.00 per person.
 - W e now have a total of 82 members.
- Max extended a thank-you and congratulations to Wayne Brumwell, Ron Baldwin, Ted Abbot and John Hunter for organizing the 2nd Annual Probus Golf Day at Whitetail Golf Course which was very successful event.
- Milt Battersby stated that the only health issue to convey and that was, member Ron Richards was progressing along quite well at the present time.
- Next Max called upon Vice President Ted to come forward to present items of interest from the Program Committee:
 - July 16th meeting will be held at the Callaghan Dairy Farm instead of at the Masonic Hall.

- President Max then adjourned meeting and the members attending the luncheon, made their way to Murphy's Den at the golf course.




My name is: <u>Brian Devan</u>.


