



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Meeting Highlights :

- President Ted Abbot called the meeting to order; followed by a group singing of "O Canada" (unsolicited warm round of applause was directed to anthem creator Bob Barkwell for his display of Olympic pictures).
- He questioned the group to see who was interested in attending the luncheon after the meeting at Teriyaki Town Restaurant which is located in the Whitney Mall on Kent Street West.
- Ted called upon Sal Polito, Director of Programs, to come forward and introduce our guest speaker for the morning, Joan Skelton, Director, Community Support Service, City of Kawartha Lakes.
- Joan informed the membership that her presentation would present a general overview of the many programs and services provided to local residents for almost 30 years by Community Care's health and support department or group. She continued by stating the agency has grown tremendously over that time to cover the expanded range of services required by the evolving needs of the community. These services are designed to promote health for all ages, to aid in the independence of seniors and special needs clients.
- Here is a brief outline of her presentation :
 - **Mission:** Community Care Health and Support Services is a leader in the collaborative design and delivery of integrated and responsive services that respect individual choice, dignity and independence.
 - **Vision:** ... a healthy community through care and support;
 - **Values:** Compassion, Accountability, Respect, Excellence;
 - The 4 "pillars" another name for the different service groups :
 - **Community Support Services** : helping seniors and people with special needs;
 - **Community Health Centre** : serving local residents who lack a family practitioner but who are in need of primary health care services.
 - **Hospice Services** : enhancing quality of life for individuals and families facing life-threatening illness and grief.
 - **Low Income Dental Clinic** : providing affordable dentistry to meet the needs of low-income individuals and families.
 - Community Support offices are located in Bobcaygeon, Fenelon Falls, and Lindsay to provide/offer aid in the following areas ;
 - Home Help & Maintenance; Hospital to Home (HAL/HF); Income Tax Preparation; Meals on Wheels; Supportive Housing & Assisted Living Service and Transportation volunteers;
